

MISCELLANEOUS

SECTION 1. BATHING IN NUDE

No person shall bathe in any of the waters of this town, in a state of nudity, in places exposed to public view, or in immediate sight of the occupants of any dwelling house.

SECTION 2. DISPOSING OF TOWN PROPERTY

Any Board or officer in charge of a department of the Town may with the approval of the Select Board, sell or otherwise dispose of in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 30B of the M.G.L., any personal property of the Town within the possession or control of a department, which has become obsolete or is not required for further use by such department.

SECTION 3. DIVING OFF BRIDGES

No person shall dive off or swim from town highway bridges.

SECTION 4. OUTDOOR MUSIC FESTIVAL

No outdoor music festival shall be conducted within the Town of Dartmouth without a license from the Board of Selectmen. In considering an application for such license, the Selectmen shall determine whether adequate police and fire protection and health safeguards will be provided. No license shall be granted until the applicant has furnished a bond in the sum of \$100,000.00 issued by a surety company authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, conditioned to indemnify the Town of Dartmouth for any loss, damage or liability caused by the conduct of such festival and guaranteeing payment of all expenses incurred by the Town of Dartmouth in providing police and fire protection at such festival.

SECTION 5. PEEPING OR SPYING INTO HOUSE

No person shall enter upon the premises of another with the intention of peeping into the windows of a house or spying in any manner upon any person or persons therein. Any person convicted of violating this by-law shall be subject to a fine not exceeding \$300.00.

MISCELLANEOUS. (cont'd)

SECTION 6. SOUND TRUCKS AND FINES

No person shall operate a sound truck or other vehicle using a sound or public address system or device on any way in the Town without first securing a permit therefor from the Select Board. Permits will be issued to applicants subject to reasonable standards promulgated by the Select Board.

SECTION 7. PAINT BALL GUNS

Sub-section 7A.

No person, other than a parent, guardian or adult who has custody and control of the minor, shall sell, provide or furnish a paint ball gun to a minor unless the minor has a permit issued by the Chief of Police or his designee, in his possession. Whoever violates this sub-section shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) and not more than three hundred dollars (\$300). A second or subsequent offense shall be punished by a fine of three hundred dollars (\$300).

Sub-section 7B.

“PAINT BALL GUNS; POSSESSION BY MINORS; SHOOTING”

No minor shall have a paint ball gun in their possession or discharge same in any place in the Town of Dartmouth to which the public has a right of access unless that minor either;

- . is accompanied by a parent, guardian or adult who has custody and control of the minor; or,
- . has a permit to carry a paint ball gun issued by the Chief of Police or his designee.

The Chief of Police or his designee shall issue a permit to carry a paint ball gun under this by-law to any person under the age of eighteen provided a parent or person having legal custody of the minor assents in writing by signing the permit to that effect. A permit for this purpose shall not be denied or revoked without just cause and an opportunity for hearing before the Chief of Police or his designee. Whoever violates this sub-section shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) and not more than two hundred dollars (\$200). A second or subsequent offense shall be punished by a fine of not less than two hundred dollars (\$200) and not more than three hundred dollars (\$300).

MISCELLANEOUS. (cont'd)

Sub-section 7C.

No person shall discharge a paint ball gun into, from or across any public way, or any way to which the public has a right of access; nor shall any person discharge a paint ball gun into, upon or from any private property without the express permission of the owner(s) or person(s) in control of the private property. Whoever violates this sub-section may be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) and not more than two hundred dollars (\$200). A second or subsequent offense shall be punished by a fine of not less than two hundred dollars (\$200) and not more than three hundred dollars (\$300).

Sub-section 7D.

Definitions for the Purposes of this By-law:

“Minor” - person under the age of eighteen (18) years of age.

“Paint Ball Gun” - an instrument or implement capable of propelling and projecting a projectile by means of air pressure or other means of propulsion which projectile leaves a distinguishing mark, stain or color upon impact which may be indelible or may be temporary in nature.

MODERATOR

SECTION 1. MODERATOR'S AUTHORITY

The Moderator shall enforce order, and all questions relating to the enforcement of order shall be decided by the Moderator without debate.

SECTION 2. TELLER APPOINTMENTS

The Moderator shall appoint two Tellers to aid him in checking the names of voters and in assorting and counting votes. He may also appoint other Tellers to assist in counting hand votes. Such Tellers shall be sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties by the Town Clerk, who shall make a record of the taking of such oath.

SECTION 3. PRO-TEM MODERATOR

The Moderator may also name a town meeting member who is a legal voter, to perform the duties of the chair for a period not exceeding two hours at one time.
