

PAY-AS-YOU-THROW INFORMATION

FOR ALL RESIDENTS WITH MUNICIPAL TRASH COLLECTION

CURBSIDE RECYCLING

You must have at least **2** bins. Use separate bins for containers and the other for paper products.



PAPER

Newspaper ★ *Cardboard*
Magazines ★ *Catalogs*

- Recycle the entire newspaper, including ads and inserts, as well as phonebooks and brown paper bags
- Flatten corrugated cardboard (maximum size 2'x3')
- Flatten paperboard (cereal & gift boxes, posters)
- Stack papers loose in the bin without strings or rubber bands
- Recycle junk mail, newsletters, office and school paper

Sorry—No soiled paper, waxy paper, pizza boxes or egg cartons or Styrofoam.



CONTAINERS

Glass ★ *Metal* ★ *#1 Plastic—#7 Plastic*
Please rinse all containers

- Glass—Food and beverage bottles & jars (all colors)
- Cans—Aluminum and steel, not including aerosol cans, aluminum foil or pie plates
- Plastic -#1 -#7 plastic bottles and jugs (soda bottles, laundry and milk jugs, etc.)

Sorry—No broken glass, window glass, pottery, china, Pyrex, light bulbs, cups, trays, bags, or motor oil containers.

CHRISTMAS TREES

Every fall, for a three week period the Department of Public Works collects leaves, grass clippings, weeds, and dead plants at curbside. **Due to public request, a spring pickup schedule has been added to the calendar.**

Christmas trees, green and flecked trees (fake snow) are collected during a two-week period in January.

Schedules will be published with specific instructions in local newspapers.

TRANSFER STATION RECYCLING CENTER

The Town's Recycling Center is located at the Transfer Station at 976 Russells Mills Road and is open Tuesdays & Thursdays from 7:30 a.m.— 3:15 p.m. and Saturdays from 7:30 a.m. — 2:45 p.m..



The following recyclable items can be dropped off free of charge:

- Newspapers, cardboard, phonebooks, magazines, office & school paper, and junk mail
- Glass food and beverage containers
- Steel and aluminum cans
- #1-#7 plastic containers
- Scrap metal
- Clean wearable clothing and shoes, eyeglasses
- Clean usable linens
- Waste oil in a clear container
- Fluorescent bulbs
- Mercury devices, such as thermometers
- Nickel-cadmium batteries
- Cell phones
- Grass and leaves
- White goods and appliances

October 24, 2009 9:00 am—noon

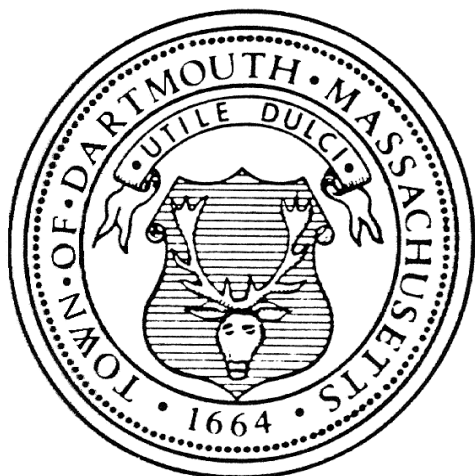
The Greater New Bedford Regional Refuse Management District sponsors a free Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day for Dartmouth residents twice a year (spring & fall). Residents are asked to bring their household hazardous waste to the Transfer Station in original labeled containers. Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper.

Bring These Household Hazardous Products:

Oil based paints, rodent poison, solvents, weed killers, stains, varnishes, kerosene, auto fluids, aerosols, gasoline, photo chemicals, lighter fluid, insecticides, paint thinner, paint stripper, oven cleaners, pool chemicals, and turpentine. If you are not sure about an item, please call the District at (508) 763-5924.

Whenever a scheduled collection day falls on a holiday, that day's collection and all remaining collections for the week are delayed one day.
