

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
DARTMOUTH SCHOOL COMMITTEE

March 20, 2023

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson John Nunes at 6:00 p.m. in the Dartmouth High School Auditorium. The Chair stated the meeting is not streaming live on the Dartmouth High School Media YouTube channel but noted the meeting is being videotaped for future broadcast over the DHS Media YouTube channel and DCTV Channels 9 and 18.

As a courtesy to all candidates, Mr. Nunes requested that attendees not post any comments of tonight's meeting on social media; Mr. Nunes extended this request to any "print" media that may be in the audience.

On a roll call the following members were present: Mr. Nunes, Mrs. Waite, Mrs. Amaral, Dr. Jenkins and Mr. Oliver.

Also present: Mr. Kiely and Mrs. Genthner.

Mr. Nunes stated that the purpose of this evening's meeting is to conduct interviews of two of the finalists for the position of Superintendent of Schools. Each finalist will be asked a series of questions by the School Committee members. No public input will be entertained.

The finalists spent the day in district visiting the schools and meeting with students and staff at each level.
