#### ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Example of half Federal, fairly common in Dartmouth. Corbelled chimney. Closed pediment with flanking pilasters around door. Splayed lintels and 12/12 windows. [Note: Preceding description transcribed from 1983 survey form]

2008 Survey Note: The 2-story wing on the left was probably added by the first half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. A 2-story rear addition is presently being added to the house with great attention to period detail including reproduction windows and a wood roof. The main house has undergone extensive alteration to the point that is difficult to discern the original fabric and window openings. The entrance door and surround appear completely rebuilt: the lack of windows on the right side of the facade and the unusual window pattern on the facade of the wing are suspicious and suggest window openings may have been removed.




