**ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:**

This is a 1-story rectangular plan low pitch gable-on-hip roof house structure partly on a parged stone foundation. A small second-entrance wing juts from the right side of the house near the rear. Tax records state this house was built in 1781. It is possible that a small Cape Cod structure is buried under the complete makeover of the house that probably occurred in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. The front façade appears to originally have been a porch, later enclosed. The porch enclosure may have been done at the same time as the rear addition as the 3 paired 2/1 windows across the front of the façade & the single 2/1 window located on the left side of the enclosure appear to be identical to those 2/1 windows located in the rear addition. The windows located on both sides of the structure are larger and capped with a distinctive trim board. These would appear to be original to the structure. There appears to be a parged brick chimney located on the middle right slope of the main block. The entrances are located on the right side of the structure. The structure is shingled and rests on parged stone with the exception of the enclosed front porch and the wing that are probably on posts enclosed with boards.

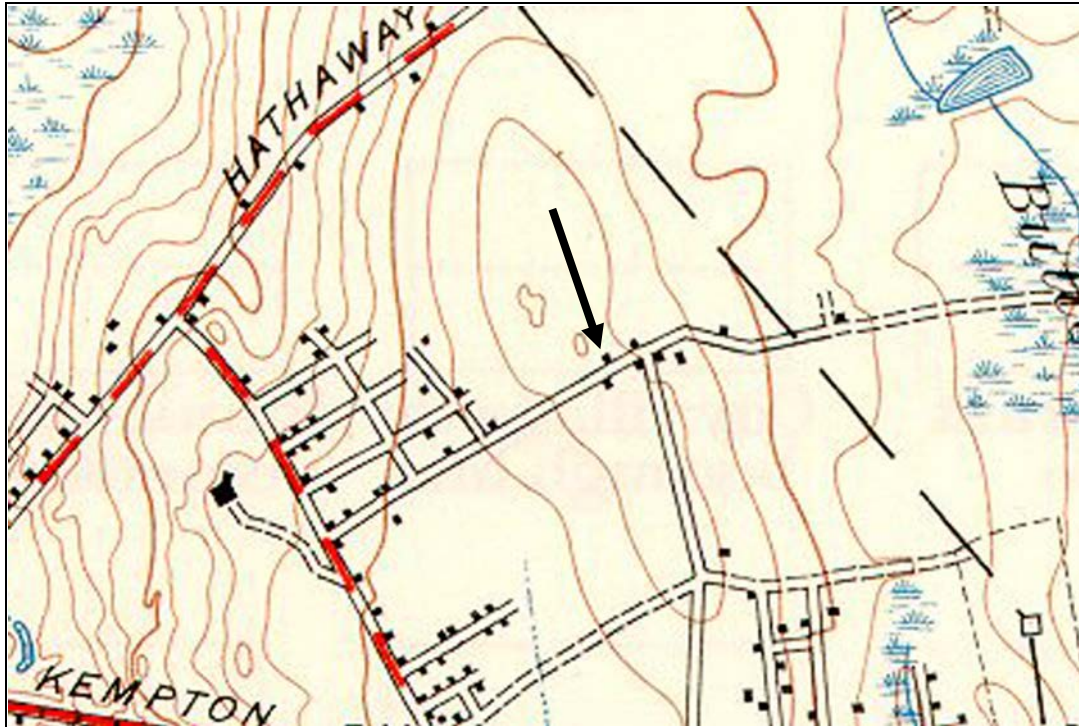

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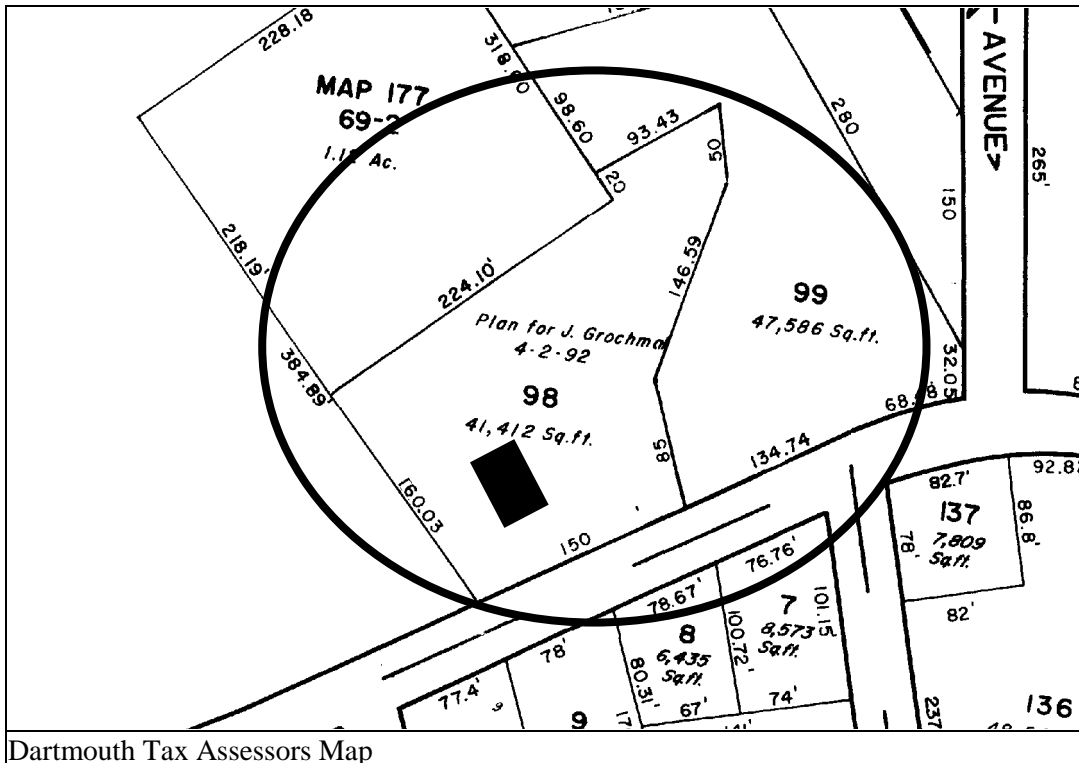
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## LOCATION MAPPING
